"I'd like to take my son to services, but I worry that his impulsive calling out might disturb other congregants who don't know about his condition."

"My mother says she'd like to come to the Scholar in Residence events, but assumes she can't get into most of the venues with her wheelchair."

"Our daughter has social anxiety disorder. She'd really like to be involved in BESTY, and we would love that, but her worries get in the way."

"My hearing loss makes it really hard for me to hear what's going on at temple. I used to love to go, but these days I miss so much--it's just a lot easier to stay at home on Shabbat and do my own thing."

Have you ever felt that you or a family member (or a friend) could not take advantage of all that our community offers because of a disability?

Then this invitation is for you.

The purpose of the ITF is to help shape community life so that all members of the community have full and easy access to all TBS activities, events and communication.

We want to have a better sense of how many people in our community might have any condition - or be affected by such a condition - be it temporary or life-long, that may be an impediment to full inclusion in the wide range of events (social, educational or spiritual) at TBS, or any of our community's communications
